Nb: Normal procedure will allow **2 places per course** to the MCD (SCC) personnel. Exceptions will be made if spaces are available.

**All applications without exception need to be sent to the MCDO at HQ 8 weeks prior to the course start date to allow for administration and allocation through Frimley Park.**

**Applications ARE NOT to be made directly to Frimley Park**

Applicants should apply for the course on a T25 using the SCC course identifying number. This application will then be forwarded to the SRMO/MCDO for checking regarding entitlement before an application is made on the student's behalf to Frimley Park. Once confirmed, Frimley Park will issue conformation and joining instructions six weeks before the course start date. MSSCHQ (Courses) will remain responsible for pay and Travel administration.

### **COURSE AIM**

1. The aim of the course is to study the planning and conduct of training and the development of practical leadership at detachment and section level.
2. The course has a secondary function in that it provides one of the required qualifications for promotion from Lieutenant to Captain and from Sergeant to Colour Sergeant.
3. The course allows students to apply to register for the ILM Award in First Line Management & CVOQ Licentiate ship in Youth Leadership and Training.

### **COURSE CRITERIA**

All students attending KGVI Advanced Course are to provide a weapons handling history sheet. The WHT is to be conducted within the previous 6 months; any applicant who fails to provide such details will not be loaded on the course.

All candidates are to have a good working knowledge of the following, before attending the course:

- JSP 535 Cadet Training Safety Precautions 2006
- Exercise Planning and giving orders
- The correct writing of EASP, associated admin instructions and annexes
- Personal Fieldcraft Skills

All candidates are to hold the following qualifications:

- QCWHT L98A1 Cadet General Purpose (GP) Rifle
- BFSS (T)
